# The Ascension

June this year is very unusual, with five Sundays and each of them marking a Solemnity. This weekend is the Ascension of the Lord, then there is Pentecost, followed by the Most Holy Trinity, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and finally, Saints Peter and Paul. So, because we are in Cycle C, our Gospel today for the Solemnity of the Accession is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Luke.

There are similarities in the reports of Jesus' Ascension found in the Synoptic Gospels—Mark, Matthew, and Luke. In each account, Jesus assigns his disciples the task of proclaiming the Gospel to the entire world. There are also notable distinctions. In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptise as well as to preach. In Luke's Gospel, however, this commission to baptise is absent. Instead, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfilment of his promise to send them the Holy Spirit. Curiously, only Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' Ascension into heaven. Matthew's Gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Only the Gospel of Mark notes that Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God. In noting this, Mark teaches that Jesus' Ascension affirms the glory Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection.

What is undeniable in all accounts of Jesus' Ascension is that it is both an ending and a beginning; it marks an absence and a presence. The physical appearances of Jesus are at an end; his revelation of the "good news" is complete; the promise of the Messiah is fulfilled. Now begins the work of the disciples: to teach what they have learned and to share what they have witnessed.

So, the words Jesus addresses to his disciples on the mountain of the Ascension are addressed to all of us two millennia later, here on the Sunshine Coast. This week we are called to teach, to witness and to heal in our own small corners of the world, to hand on to others the story that has been handed on to us about Jesus and his Gospel of love and compassion.

Hospitality is the focus of our community on the first weekend of every month – please accept this invitation to join your fellow parishioners and visitors after Mass today.



The preparation is getting serious for 101 of our younger parishioners as they prepare to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation on Thursday, June 12<sup>th</sup>. Over the past couple of weeks, working on the foundation provided by their families, they have gathered on a Wednesday night, deepening their faith and understanding. Now, with only two weeks to go, there is an urgency to the preparation as they get ready to take this next important step in their spiritual journey – we keep them and their families in our prayers during this time. We also pray that we might be a Parish Family that is a good witness of faith to these younger and important members of our community.
