The second week of our First Holy Communion preparation continues this weekend. Last week, the focus was on what we do when we come to Mass – *We gather*, *we listen, we focus on the altar*, and then *we are sent*. This weekend, our attention is drawn to the Eucharistic Prayer and Jesus' command at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me". We gather at Mass because we are faithful to Jesus command – that is what brings us to Mass today! We keep all our younger members of our Parish Family who are preparing to receive their First Holy Communion in our prayers today.

Welcome to the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Our scripture this weekend comes from Ecclesiastes 1:2,2:21-23, Colossians 3:1-5,9-11 and the Gospel is from Luke 12:13-21, and it tells the story of the rich young man.

Embracing the faith communities of St Mary's Buderim, St Peter's Coolum, Stella Maris Maroochydore and St Catherine of Siena, Sippy Downs.

Lord, teach us to pray

It is one of the great paradoxes of life that the easiest things can be the most difficult. The same is true for prayer. I have at times been asked something along the lines of "I want to start praying more intentionally, what should I do?".

The answer is both incredibly easy and incredibly difficult; just sit in silence and clear your mind of anything but God. It sounds very easy, sit quietly, sit still, and clear your mind, but very quickly we discover what a task this is. The Spiritual Director of the Seminary, Fr. Paul Chandler, describes it as turning off little radios all over your house so you can have a conversation with God. We can hardly pray, have a conversation with God, if our little radios are blaring "That report is due Monday", "I should text James back", or "Where did I put my keys?".

Part of prayer is to go around and turn off these little radios, to try and take ourselves out of our busy life and sit quietly with God. Sometimes all we end up doing in our prayer is finding more radios to turn off and that's okay, the more we try, the easier it becomes. Sometimes we need to bring those radios into our prayer, the fact that we can't get rid of them may be an invitation from God to say, "God, I am struggling with this, please give me the Grace to get through it" rather than pushing them away or ignoring them, bring them to God. Unlike some other faiths or meditative practices, the goal is not to reach some kind of thoughtless bliss, a state of detachment or to rise above the world. Instead, we are opening up a space for God, leaving a place of silence in our noisy lives where God can touch our hearts. That can be the scariest part sometimes, often silence is just an invitation for the things we normally try to avoid becoming even louder.

Silence is like a magnifying glass that we look at ourselves with, it tells us what we think is important, what we are running away from and what has hurt us. It's in the silence that God will often meet us, just as he met Elijah. Elijah went into the desert and heard great winds and the sounds of massive rocks smashing and a great fire raging, but God wasn't in any of those things; instead he found God in the "voice of a thin silence".

When the Patron Saint of Parish Priests, Fr. John Vianney, was asked what he did while he sat in front of the Eucharist for hours at a time, he just said, "I look at Him and He looks at me". This is the great 'secret' of prayer. There's no trick or formula or secret handshake, just sit with God and let Him sit with you. It is hard, it takes time, but just like the man in the Gospel, if we keep knocking, God will open the door.

The trick with the preparation pack is — don't procrastinate! Because none of us what to be like the rich young man in this weekend's gospel!!!

Best Practice

The protocol for all our Eucharistic Ministers who take Communion to our sisters and brothers who are sick, housebound, in hospital or nursing homes is that before you place your pyx on the offertory table, please record your name and the names of those whom you are going to see (the folder is at the entrance of each church). This important ministry always takes place on the day, ideally following when commissioned at the end of Mass, and only commissioned Eucharistic Ministers are allowed to take the Blessed Sacrament from the church.
