Welcome, everyone, visitors and locals alike, to the 19th Sunday of the Church's year. Our scripture this weekend comes from Wisdom 18:6-9, Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19 and the Gospel is from Luke 12:32-48, and the challenge this week to always be prepared!!!

Be Prepared Be Ready Be Faithful

I travel by aeroplane rather irregularly these days – I can't stand the thought of queues! However, what always amazes me is how nonchalant my fellow passengers are when it comes to listening to the hostess/flight steward's presentation pointing out the safety features of their aircraft. People seem rather blasé as they ignore the instructions about fastening the seat belts and the number and location of safety exits, and various emergency procedures. The crew goes on to explain that an individual oxygen mask will be lowered in front of each person in the event of a sudden loss of pressure, and that under the seat is a life jacket in the event of the aeroplane ending up in the ocean. All of this is supposed to help the passengers to be prepared for the unexpected. Few pay any attention at all. This demonstration serves only to unnerve the nervous.

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives us some instructions regarding the flight of life – a flight in which we are all involved. He tells us to be prepared for the unexpected. Like faithful servants, we should keep ourselves in a state of readiness and preparedness. How little attention people pay to this. However, as we grow older, we become more aware of how fleeting life is and how tenuous a hold we have on it. We are not made of stone, but of rather fragile material. Almost daily in my hospital rounds, I see how microscopic viruses can immobilise otherwise healthy people.

Jesus was aware of the uncertainty of life, and he stressed that death could come at any moment. All of us would like to be able to end our lives with our plans carried out and our work done. We don't know if we will have that chance. Henry David Thoreau said in *On Walden Pond*: "Fear not that your life will end: rather fear that it may never have begun." We have a precarious hold on life, but what we do have is an opportunity to be faithful to the tasks that we have been given, like the servants Jesus spoke of. If we are not prepared and alert, we will squander this gift of life.

As Mother Teresa said, we are not called to be successful, we are only called to be faithful.

That is why today's scripture is a perfect segue to reminding every parishioner – you are never too old or too young – to take home and talk about and then complete our Parish Funeral Preparation Pack. You can pick up an envelope at the entrance to the church. It simply gives you the opportunity to give to those you love the most some direction on how you want to celebrate your life – as people of faith, there is something healthy about talking about and being practical about the one inevitability that none of us will take a shortcut around!




