When parishioners and visitors walk through the doors of any of our four churches, I sometimes wonder if everyone fully appreciates the vast armada of people involved in ensuring that Mass starts on time! Sure, there are the people we see each week, such as the readers and Eucharistic ministers, the children's church leaders and Mass coordinators, the sacristans and welcomers, not to mention the musicians, singers and those who operate our audio-visual systems - they are the face of our Parish Family. Behind them are also the countless nameless fellow parishioners who vacuum and clean our churches week in and week out, those who wash our vestments and altar linen, those who decorate our churches with floral arrangements and the many who weekly provide food and hospitality after Mass. Others, of course, quietly drive fellow parishioners to and from Mass, while others are commissioned to take Holy Communion to those who can't join us. Finally, I suppose, we are all involved and have a vested stake in our weekly Mass. This is because every time we contribute something financial on the collection plate, we support the ministry of the Finance Committee who keeps our lights on, budgets for the future, ensures the necessary maintenance is carried out and slowly but surely reduces our parish debt of \$1,358,933. So, this First Holy Communion weekend, as we celebrate Mass together, let's appreciate the generous Parish Community we belong to and the role we all play in celebrating the Eucharist that gives meaning to our lives and hope for our journey.

# TRAVEL TIPS FOR

It is no secret that Australians love to travel. In fact, only last week it was reported that, for the first time in more than 30 years, more Australians travelled overseas than overseas visitors reached our shores. These days, you are likely to find Australians everywhere. Certainly, in the West Indies, the novelty of having an Australian as Parish Priest soon wore off, as there was always another Australian passing through as a crew member on a boat or simply exploring the different islands of the Caribbean.

And one thing these travellers have most in common is that they have done some preparation and research on where they are going and what they hope to see and experience. You just have to look in the book store to discover the large number of travel books from Lonely Planet to Europe on Fifty Dollars a Day – covering the most mundane places to the most exotic locations. If the place exists, odds on there is a travel guide for it!

These travel books urge you to prepare well, but then to take a risk and go off the beaten path. Go beyond the tourist trail and sample local cuisine and customs. Be flexible and be open to a change in your plans if something interesting presents

That's a good summary of the advice for disciples which Jesus gives in today's Gospel. We have all heard these "travel hints" for the discipleship road before: Enter by the narrow gate; be prepared for the Master's coming; be open and flexible. Why? Because the Kingdom of God will include unexpected challenges. The people who will be welcomed to the table in the kingdom might surprise you, especially if you're on the outside, looking in!

Most young people are said to believe in a hell where nobody goes. Many others, perhaps adults, think there is a hell largely populated by their enemies. And among the <u>old</u> are believers who nervously wonder if hell might be populated by the likes of themselves. They, like St Paul at some moments, consider the question of their salvation "in fear and trembling."

I suppose that is why it is timely to reflect upon our own "travel plans' as Christ's disciples. We take seriously the tips in the travel books, but how seriously do we take the tips that Christ offers? How inclusive is our Sunshine Coast Catholic Community? How willing are we to explore new ways of forgiving and being witnesses of the Good News? How have we prepared by study and prayer to speak up for Christian values? Are we making choices for the Gospel, even if they're unpopular with the prevailing cultural values of our Australian society? The Gospel road may be off the beaten path, but following it is the road to salvation.




