Everyone loves a party! Have you ever wondered what sort of party Jesus would throw? What sort of host would he be? Or, how would Jesus act as a guest? This weekend's gospel of the wedding feast and the embarrassment of getting a good seat only to be told, humiliatingly, that you are in the wrong seat and you have to move to a lower seat, gives us a bit of a clue! So, when Jesus speaks of the "lowest place" in today's gospel, he is talking more of an attitude than location, a question of generosity rather than place setting. In doing so, Jesus is challenging us to see one another from the perspective of Christ-like humility that realises that we are not the centre of all things but part of a much larger world.

Our scripture this weekend comes from Sirach 3:17-20, 28-29, Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24 and the Gospel is from Luke 14:1, 7-14 and deals with humility and embarrassment!

### What If ???

This weekend, we will hear a lot about humility. Humility, in a nutshell, is how we respond to what we perceive as attacks on our pride. A singer in a concert may think "Only I can do this", but if he gets hit by a bus, the understudy will step in and the show will go on. A Prime Minister may think themselves quite important, but if they aren't around, the Deputy is right there to step up and do the job for them. Humility is realising that even though we have gifts and are called to use them for the good of others, none of us is irreplaceable and none of us are responsible for them; they come from God, that's why they're called gifts. One of the great things about Australian culture is that it values humility, we don't like to make a big deal of ourselves or pretend that we're the only ones who can do something. Sometimes things just happen, when we can't be around. Humility is the ability to say "thank you" when somebody fills in for us. Pride is to say "if it's not me, then there's no way it could possibly be done". It may not be the same, it may not be done as well, but it's better than the alternative of nothing at all.

This is very true in a Parish, especially our Parish, which is the largest by Catholic population in all of Queensland! With so many people and so many ministries going on, things are bound to go a little wrong sometimes. When one of our readers is sick or can't make it to their rostered Mass, we don't cancel Mass, we find a replacement and we carry on as normal. The same is true for our priests although unfortunately, we don't have any extra priests who can step in at the last minute. So, what do we do? Should we just pretend it will never happen and hope for the best, or is there something we can do just in case an emergency does happen?

Occasionally, we aren't able to have Mass. Either there is a crash on the highway, the Priest is unwell, there's been a hospital emergency or any number of other reasons. Rather than cancelling Mass, the Church has provided us an alternative, which we find in the Canon Law on the topic of being unable to attend Mass because there isn't a priest. "It is strongly recommended that the faithful take part in a liturgy of the word if such a liturgy is celebrated in a parish church". To gather, listen to the Word of God, pray together and receive Communion. This is called a Liturgy of the Word and Communion. Our brothers and sisters in the country Parishes experience these quite regularly. With only a single Priest to cover a vast area, it's not always possible for them to have Mass even on a Sunday, so they gather for a Liturgy of the Word and Communion.

If Mass is meant to begin and no Priest has arrived, those delegated by their local groups, trained and commissioned to be leaders of these Liturgies, will pick up the book that we have put together for them and will begin as normal. Either the priest will arrive in which case they will take over and Mass will go ahead as normal, or the priest doesn't arrive, and the Liturgy of the Word and Communion will continue. Either way, we will still gather as the people of God, the Word of God will be proclaimed, we will unite in prayer, and we will have the opportunity to receive Communion consecrated at a previous Mass.

To help with this, we have developed some 'break glass in case of emergency' folders for each of our four churches for them to use. If you've been to any Liturgies of the Word and Communion that I have done throughout the Parish, then you've seen one of these folders in action. These have been designed so that the person leading the Liturgy doesn't have to do anything other than read the words, the folders even tell them when to sit down and when to stand up!

The most important thing to remember is that these Liturgies are not an alternative option to Mass; instead, they are an alternative option to cancelling Mass. If we can have Mass, then we will, but rather than cancelling Mass and sending everyone home because Father has come down with the Flu, we will celebrate a Liturgy of the Word and Communion instead.
