This project aligns with the Wish for Education to create safe, inclusive learning environments where every student feels supported, heard, and valued—not just academically, but emotionally as well.

We are incredibly proud to share that we were announced as the winners this week. What does that mean? \$2,000 for our school and yes, it's going straight towards a second cold bubbler for our back courts. This bubbler dream was the driving force behind our students' submission. The video team, along with our SRCs and Senior student leaders, voted to dedicate the prize to this cause.
