Welcome as we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Our scripture this weekend comes from **Numbers 21:4-9**, **Philippians 2:6-11** and the Gospel is from **John 3:13-17**

Parish Communion Training

We are blessed to be such a vibrant parish! Every week we welcome new faces—some who have just moved into the area, others who may not have stepped foot inside a Catholic church for many years, and even some who are walking through our doors for the very first time. This means that what we do at Mass matters. The way we serve not only supports our regular parishioners but also offers visitors the very best encounter with Christ and His Church.

Last Saturday, our parish gathered for Communion training, and what a vital reminder it was of the precious gift we hold in our hands at every Mass. Statistics today are both shocking and sad: only 10% of people who identify as Catholic attend Mass regularly, and of that group, 70% do not believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

But we must be clear: when we speak of the Eucharist, we are not speaking of a symbol, or even just a moment where we feel the "power of Christ," like in a song that moves us or a homily that stirs our hearts. At the consecration, through the words of the priest and the power of the Holy Spirit, the bread and wine become the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. The appearances remain, but the reality is completely changed.

That means when we hold the Host or offer the Chalice, we are holding and offering Jesus Himself. What a profound responsibility! No wonder the angels themselves are jealous of this privilege given to us.

Because of this, our training reminded us of the seriousness and love with which we approach this ministry. We spoke about practical things:

- If a Host is dropped, pick it up immediately—never ignore it. The minister will place the dropped host back in the Paten and deal with the dropped host later.
- If the Precious Blood is spilled, cover the spot with a purifier and continue; it will be cleaned reverently after Mass.
- Hold the paten with care and reverence.
- When someone approaches with arms crossed, do not give a blessing with the Host. Simply place it back in the paten, smile, and with an extended hand say, "God bless you."
- At Stella Maris, stand on the green dot when distributing Communion. In other communities, be mindful of spacing to avoid long lines crossing over.
- Always say the words clearly: "The Body of Christ," "The Blood of Christ." Look at the person, smile, and serve with reverence.
- Remain watchful—if someone does not consume the Host immediately, in a polite manner, ensure that they do. Sadly, there are those who seek to take the Eucharist for desecration, which shows even they know it is not just bread, but Jesus truly present.
- If you have any mobility challenges, we warmly encourage you and your family to sit in the front row so that Communion Ministers can come to you first. This helps us ensure everyone receives with ease and reverence, as Communion will not be distributed throughout the congregation.

Serving as a Minister of Holy Communion is not just a roster duty—it is a profound honour. It is a privilege beyond compare, one that angels themselves long for. Let us take this ministry seriously, approach it humbly, and serve with the joy of knowing that when we give the Host or the Chalice, we are truly giving Jesus Christ Himself.
