How we remember the *dead* is significant in how we *live*. That is because all of us live on the boundary of eternity, where past, present, and future are as one. The memory of those who have shared our journey, handed on the faith to us, been examples of sacrifice, determination and love, helps form who we are as we walk along that boundary. That is why we do not want to forget them; that is why it is important to remember them.

This year, All Saints Day falls on Saturday, 1st November and All Souls Day falls on the following day, Sunday, 2nd November. While on the Sunday, we will definitely remember all the faithful departed, 9:00am on Saturday, 1st November, at Stella Maris, we will have our special Mass of Remembrance, calling to mind those who have died in our community, especially over the past 12 months. For as the Jewish prayer reminds us, "as long as we live, they too will live; for they are now a part of us; as we remember them".

Since we are already thinking about November, it is not a bad time to make sure you have collected your **Funeral Preparation Pack**. They are available at the entrance to the church. The purpose of the preparation envelope is not to be taken home and collect dust. It is to be opened, reflected upon and discussed with your loved ones. Please fill out and then return to the parish office (or some obvious place at home), where hopefully it will not be opened for many years to come. By spending a little time completing the Funeral Preparation Pack, it will give you peace of mind and certainly take a lot of pressure off those you love the most as they gather to celebrate your life. The trick with the preparation pack is — **don't procrastinate!**

Good to Know

It is a privilege, and not a right, to come forward and receive Holy Communion in our Parish Family. We are conscious of our fellow parishioners who, for whatever reason, cannot receive Holy Communion. They are, however, along with anyone who joins us, and who is not a Catholic, welcome to come forward with the community and receive a blessing. When you approach the minister, simply cross your arms and you will receive a blessing.

There are some common rituals and habits that unite us, who receive Holy Communion. Paragraph 160 of the official General Instruction of the Roman Missal explains that the sign of reverence for the sacred elements is a bow that is made as communicants approach the ministers distributing Communion, "when approaching to receive Holy Communion, the faithful bow in reverence of the Mystery that they are to receive". Communicants are to make a simple bow of the head when they step forward to receive the consecrated elements from the minister. Such a bow can be done simply, without disrupting the flow of the Communion Procession. You consume the Blessed Sacrament immediately on receiving it.
