Receiving Holy Communion

The focus in last weekend's Parish newsletter was on receiving Holy Communion. In such a large and busy Parish as ours, with so many visitors and new parishioners joining us, sometimes we take for granted that everyone knows what to do when it comes to receiving Holy Communion. Also, sometimes we unintentionally get into incorrect habits, so this is a great time to remind ourselves of how we should receive Holy Communion in our Sunshine Coast Parish Family. With that said, what are the 6 steps to remember?



ONE: In our Catholic faith, receiving Holy Communion is central to who we are, and it reminds us of who we are called to be! Nourished by receiving the Eucharist, we strive to become what we have received. To receive the Eucharist, you must, among other requirements, be a baptised Catholic and free of any grave sins. Leading up to receiving Holy Communion, we prepare by prayer, reflection and participating fully in the Mass.



TWO: At Communion time, in preparation, quietly lift your kneeler, so that those following you are not obstructed. Then leave your pew and, with your fellow Catholics, proceed to the front of the church. As you proceed to the altar, always be conscious of the privilege of being able to receive the Blessed Sacrament.



THREE: As a sign of reverence for the Blessed Sacrament, as you approach the Priest or Eucharistic minister, make a sign of reverence, such as a bow. For example, once the person ahead of you has received Communion, bend slightly at the hips, then step forward within arm's length of the priest so that you may receive the sacrament yourself.



FOUR: Receive the host in your hands or on your tongue. If you wish to have the host handed to you, hold out your hands, left on top of right. The Eucharist is always given, *never taken*, so do not take the host from the priest, but rather allow them to place it in your hand. You consume the consecrated host immediately – you don't walk off with the host!



FIVE: Receive the Precious Blood. After receiving the host, you may choose to receive the Blood of Christ. Take a small sip from the chalice that is offered to you. The person offering the cup will say "the Blood of Christ," and you respond (as before) with a bow and a proclamation of your faith: "Amen." By saying "Amen", you are actually proclaiming aloud, "Yes, I believe".



SIX: Return to your seat and pray as you kneel. This is a time to reflect and pray in thanks-giving. It is also a chance to think about the journey that has brought you to this moment and a time to call to mind the challenges that lie ahead of you as you contemplate the next 7 days. Follow the lead of your fellow Catholics if you are unsure what to do.





The churches, schools and parish infrastructure of our Stella Maris Parish are a living legacy of the vision, sacrifice and determination of those who *handed on the faith* to us. So, a person or family has the confidence that their financial contribution will still be working for the mission of the Church and Parish, ten, fifty or a hundred years from now!

With the support of the Parish Finance Council, the Stella Maris Endowment Fund has been established. This fund, independently and professionally managed, will support the work and mission of the Parish in perpetuity. It is an option for anyone or any family wishing to make a contribution to the long term mission and maintenance of Stella Maris. There are information envelopes at the entrance to the church. By inviting you to consider supporting the Stella Maris Endowment Fund through remembering the fund in your will or making a pledge today, our hope is that the fund will continue to grow.
