Where Faith and Life Meet

I don't know about you, but for me, All Souls' Day seems to get more and more meaningful, the older I get. This is the one day in the year when we especially remember and pray for those who have died, and the older you get, comes the realisation that one day, sooner rather than later, there will be someone remembering and praying for you. It is a sobering thought!

This year, here in our Sunshine Coast Parish family, we have buried many dear members of our community. Every funeral I am privileged to celebrate brings me to a greater awareness of the brevity of life. **It's short, it's fleeting, it's fast**. Even if one lives to be in their 90s, life is still short, just ask anyone in their 90s!

The fledgling early church knew this and prayed for and remembered those who had died for the very same reason that we still do today. All our memories today are unique and extremely personal – they capture those who are no longer with us and who have taught us in so many ways how to live and love and have added to the great tapestry of our lives. They offered us gifts of faith, trust, and courage, which are intertwined with our doubts and fears and uncertainties. Today, we remember each of them. Their faith gives us courage to continue. They are our guides and mentors, and for each of them, we give thanks.

When those first Christians prayed for their loved ones who had died, they did so in order to give thanks to Almighty God for their witness, their courage, and above all, their faith. They did so because they recognised the unbreakable bond that joins us all together in Christ, the living and the dead alike. Death cannot tear asunder the family of Christ; death cannot tear asunder the communion that we share in Christ with each other, whether we are here on earth or have gone on into the next life.

This is best captured by the English Benedictine priest, the Venerable Bede, who lived from 673-735AD. Thirteen hundred years ago, he wrote: We seem to give them back to you, O God, who gave them first to us. Yet as you did not lose them in giving, so we do not lose them by their return. Not as the world gives do you give. What you give you do not take away. For what is yours is also ours. We are yours and life is eternal. And love is immortal, and death is only a horizon, and a horizon is but the limit of our sight.

One day death will come to claim us, but death cannot defeat us! Until then, we commemorate and pray for the 'faithful departed',—those who are now gone from us. However, we do so knowing that they are 'faithful' in the fullest sense; never abandoned by God, who is not only the object of our faith, but the source of it as well. As we pray for all the souls this weekend, may we have the courage to one day be counted in their company by our own faithfulness, sacrifices and love.

Seniors visit the Preps


