This weekend's scripture speaks about God's house or temple. The church is more than a building – we are the living stones on which the church is built, but are challenged to remember that the construction of the church is not yet finished.

Welcome to everyone as we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

Our scripture this weekend comes from Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12, 1 Corinthians 3:9-11, 16-17 and the Gospel is from John 2:13-22

Embracing the faith communities of St Mary's Buderim, St Peter's Coolum, Stella Maris Maroochydore and St Catherine of Siena Sippy Downs.

Our Parish has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk are paramount.

"The most holy Church of the Lateran, the mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world!"

These words, in Latin, greet every pilgrim entering through the front door of the basilica of St. John in the Lateran in Rome and clearly proclaim the Lateran's significance in Christianity.

For the second week running, we have a feast that takes precedence over the normal Sunday liturgy. Just as last week, the feast of the commemoration of all the faithful departed (All Souls Day) took precedence, so today the feast of the dedication of the Lateran basilica, dedicated to Saint John the Baptist, replaces the 32nd Sunday. Perhaps it sounds unusual to have a feast focusing on a building, but it is a very special building.

The first Christian emperor, Constantine, had a church built on land that once belonged to the Laterani family. That fourth century church was the precursor of the present Basilica. The Baptistery attached to the present Basilica is where Emperor Constantine was baptised.

We call the Lateran the mother of every church edifice because it was the first legalised Christian Church in history. It is the head, because Rome is the principal Church of the principal local Church in the world, the Diocese of Rome, the see of St. Peter, the vicar on earth of the Head of the Mystical Body.

We sometimes forget that it is The Lateran, not St. Peter's, which is the Pope's Cathedral. It is The Lateran, not St Peter's, where his *cathedra*, the chair symbolic of his teaching authority, rests. The Lateran, not the Vatican, is where the Popes resided for the first millennium of legalised Christianity (324-1308). This is the reason why on 9th November every year, not just the Diocese of Rome, but the whole Roman Catholic Church celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of their Head and Mother. For that reason, it has the title, "mother and head of all the churches of the city and the world," and that includes our own parish churches of Stella Maris, St Mary's, St Peter's and St Catherine's, where we celebrate the Eucharist each week.

But importantly, what we celebrate today is more than an impressive sacred building! What comes through this weekend's scripture is that the Church is not a building made up of bricks and mortar, but instead made up of ourselves, as 'living stones', and that our four local faith communities are the 'temples' that God has built in this time, and in this place to bear witness to the Good News.
