Welcome to Ordinary Time 2026, a split liturgical season so designated not because it is dull or boring in comparison with the Advent–Christmas seasons just completed, or the Lent–Easter seasons to come. The word *ordinary* stems from the *ordinal numbers*: Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, and so forth.

Scripturally, Ordinary Time focuses on the words and deeds of Jesus as he proclaims the Kingdom of God to the people of Israel and, through them, to the world. During these weeks, we hear Jesus teach with wisdom and creativity, we witness his effectiveness as a preacher, and we marvel at his miracles. In short, Ordinary Time is an invitation to deepen our relationship with Jesus and fathom what it means to be a follower at this moment in time and in this place.

So in practical terms, Ordinary Time is divided into two parts. The first part begins this weekend and will continue until Ash Wednesday (18th February) and the beginning of Lent. During these weeks the focus will be on the early ministry of Jesus and his teachings. The second part of Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost, following the Easter season, and continues until the beginning of Advent. During this time, the Church reflects on the mission of Christ and the growth of the Church, encouraging us to accept the challenge to authentically live out the teachings of Jesus in daily life.

You might remember last week, Jesus was baptised at the River Jordan. This weekend, we remain on the muddy banks of the Jordan River with the anxious crowds and John the Baptist. There is a great sense of expectation among the people that the One promised, the One foretold by the prophets, the One they were waiting for was close at hand. John the Baptist sees Jesus coming, and pointing toward him, says something that we still hear today every time we celebrate the Eucharist together: *'Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.'*

We usually don't think of John the Baptist having much in common with us but actually, I think we have more in common with John the Baptist than we realise. John and all those milling around the River Jordan that day were searching, on the lookout for the Messiah, the promised One. They all had their own expectation of who the Messiah would be and what he would do. I wonder if we are really that different?

Here we are living in our Sunshine Coast Catholic Parish, facing this same challenge that God gave John. We are supposed to be on the lookout for God's activity, and of course, we have just spent Christmas hearing the stories of how close God wants to be to us. But now Christmas is over, and we want to see God present in our everyday life, even in the middle of our country reeling from acts of terror and a world order that seems to be crumbling before our eyes.

The ordinariness of God can be an obstacle for us. We are hoping for voices from on high and dramatic messages, and instead God communicates through the faces of friends and strangers and the day to day interactions of our lives. Even prayer isn't what people often think it is. Many of the great masters of prayer say that we need to begin by speaking with God, not in exalted language but as one friend to another, a conversation where there is nothing that we can't say and there is nothing we can't ask, and where answers aren't nearly as dramatic as we sometimes want them to be.

So, this week, if you are like John the Baptist and want to get a look at the God you're waiting for, he is not hiding, and is not impossible for us to relate to. Sometimes we are the ones who are keeping that God at a distance. We don't see him where he is, and he is where he needs to be, *including here with us now!*

COMMUNITY MEALS FOR THE DISADVANTAGED, HOMELESS & VULNERABLE

During 2017, in response to the obvious need within our Sunshine Coast community, a ministry was established to provide a meal on a regular basis for those who are vulnerable, homeless or disadvantaged in any way. The vision and mission of this ministry are driven by Jesus' words in Matthew's Gospel: *"Truly I tell you, just as you did it to the least of one of these, who are members of my family, you did it to me."*

At that time, it was recognized that the importance was not just to give out food but to provide a safe environment where a meal could be shared. Shared meals bring people together, build community, and create a sense of belonging. Everyone deserves a sense of belonging. It was also recognised that any food prepared and shared had to be nutritious and healthy!

So, every Friday evening on the grounds of Stella Maris Church, this ministry takes place. Currently, there are five teams of volunteers - three parish teams and two from our schools, Siena College and Stella Maris Primary, who take it in turns to prepare and serve the meals. These volunteers not only source, cook and serve meals to our friends, numbers of which can reach the 40s, but also sit and chat with them, providing a sense of community. Orange Sky are also in attendance, providing washing and drying facilities for their clothing.

This ministry is also well-supported by parishioners who make regular financial contributions with which the food is purchased. Additionally, many volunteers also provide food items at their own expense. Here, we must acknowledge the support of parishioner, Brenda Wolley, who provides delicious home-made baking every week – three containers, often themed, e.g. Christmas, Easter, St Patrick's Day. Thanks also to Woolworths, Cotton Tree Meats and Crust Bakery at Mountain Creek, who are also very generous with donations and discounts.

We currently have a good number of volunteers on all teams, but any parishioners who would like to express their interest in joining a team when the need arises or would like to find out how to support us, please contact the parish office with your name, email address and phone number. **A big thank you to all members of our Sunshine Coast Catholic Parish for your support of this most important ministry—it is appreciated.**
