What happens when we die?

It's probably one of the most sought after answers known to humanity. What happens to us when we die? What will it be like when we go to heaven?

There's a fantastic TV Show on Netflix titled, The Good Place. In a comedic way, the show wrestles with the concept of the afterlife and brings to the forefront of our minds, the philosophical and meaningful questions we might encounter.

We began our week with All Saints Day and All Souls' Day which served as reminders to us that we need to be intentional with our earthly pilgrimage. Our time here on earth matters and what we do here matters. This, in part, is what the Sadducees failed to see. They were more concerned with cornering Jesus and disproving him to the detriment of their own souls.

We started a long journey to Jerusalem on the Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, where we heard Jesus "resolutely set his face towards Jerusalem," in chapter nine of Luke's Gospel. This weekend we come to chapter twenty of Luke's Gospel and hear of Jesus in the temple with the learned and leaders of the faith. Chapter nineteen was Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

Our questions today follow a line of tests that the Sadducees and Pharisees designed in order to catch Jesus in blasphemy or lawlessness. The Sadducees themselves did not believe in the Resurrection of the body or the immortality of the soul, so the fact that they asked this question truly reveals their desire to outclass Jesus.

At the end of the day, the answer to their questions weren't really answers that would affect the average person, simply because the Sadducees were an exclusive upper-class assembly that kept to themselves. Moreover, because they didn't believe in the resurrection, they weren't invested in the answer.

We, as regular Mass attending people, could perhaps fall into a similar trap if we don't continue to keep our eyes outward to see the needs of our neighbour. With the truths and foundations of faith that we enjoy as Catholics, we can fall into the trap of theologising in an echo-chamber that is not aware of the real and important needs of the world.

Our invitation, and indeed our call as followers of Christ, is to maintain a balance of faith in the way we speak and act. The hope is that our prayer life might animate our ministerial life. What we do here on earth is connected to our eternal home. May we be prepared to meet with our Lord in the resurrection and be united in mind, body and soul with our God. It won't be the Good Place of our TV show, but it'll be the Right Place to begin our new life into eternity – one that goes beyond marriage, race or culture. New life in eternity is found in God and when we're united in God, nothing else matters.
