Dear Parishioners,

As you may have read in the short biography that was posted in an earlier parish newsletter, I have done a variety of different things in my life before I entered the Seminary. In the past I have worked for many different bosses and CEOs. I did this ultimately in the pursuit of happiness. I thought that having the right job, getting the latest gadgets, having a nice car, relationships, a bigger pay slip... would satisfy my search and deep longing for joy. I later realised that all this was doing was serving myself and my own wants.

Today we hear in the beautiful first reading from Isaiah that "you are my servant... who formed me in the womb to be his servant." Furthermore, these words are echoed, in a more nuanced way in the Gospel reading from John. John the Baptist was serving God through his particular calling and in his particular way. John was a man who went about the countryside boldly serving God through his preaching, teaching his own disciples, Baptising, and always pointing towards God.

This leaves us with the question "how we are serving God?". Serving God can look many different ways and take place in many different spaces. Often the most important ways to serve God take place outside the walls of our Church. That is not to say that serving our parish community is not necessary and essential. I am simply saying that our parish community is where we can fill up our gas tanks to then go forth and make other disciples.

Therefore, our activities and service must, like John in today's Gospel, always point towards God. The way we look after and treat ourselves in a positive way serves God. The way we act towards our family members, especially the ones that are difficult to deal with, serves God. Who we are and the way we act when we are around our friends serves God. It is only when we serve God with freedom and love that we will find what our hearts so deeply desire.

as we, together, celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time.

The title *Ordinary Time* is a bit misleading. Many people think Ordinary Time refers to parts of the calendar of the Catholic Church that are unimportant. Actually, Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered.

The Latin word *ordinalis*, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo*, from which we get the English word *order*. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church - the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. *Nothing ordinary about that!*

So we set off on this journey which will only be interrupted by Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday, falling on February 22 this year.

Baptismal Preparation

On the first Thursday of every month we host our Baptismal Preparation meeting. At this short meeting we explain the ritual and the meaning behind the symbols used in the ceremony and answer any questions before confirming dates and times of baptism. The next preparation meeting will be held at Stella Maris Church on Thursday, February 2nd, at 6pm. If you would like to book and receive the paperwork in advance, please contact the parish office.
