Our Parish has zero tolerance for all forms of abuse and is committed to safeguarding everyone involved in its activities, ministries and services. The safety and wellbeing of children and adults-at-risk is paramount.

Did you know that 70% of the Australian mainland is classified as semi-arid, arid or desert? The heart of our nation is a dry and barren place. Yet, for our spiritual lives, there's more to the desert than just heat and sand.

In the scriptures, the desert holds a significant place in the life of the salvific story.

- The desert is a place of purification. Purified by the heat as gold is refined by fire.
- The desert is a place of preparation. The endurance necessary for the desert prepares us for the road ahead.

The first prime example of the value of the desert comes from the book of Exodus. God the Father delivered Israel from the slavery of Egypt, and the People of God didn't immediately go straight into the Promised Land but they went through the desert. They went through this purification and this preparation.

In the midst of it all, they were taught to rely on the providence of God. They were given the presence of the Lord in the Ark of the Covenant and they were reminded of the importance of their worship and commitment to God throughout the whole journey.

Our Gospel this weekend parallels the lessons of the People of Israel and shows us that Jesus stands as the new model of fidelity.

When the People of God were hungry, the Lord provided manna from heaven, but Jesus said, "one does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God."

When the People of God were complaining about being abandoned by God, the Lord continuously came to their aid, but Jesus said "You must not put the Lord your God to the test."

When the People of God made their own idols and gods, the Lord made his power known to them but Jesus says "You must worship the Lord your God and serve God alone."

Jesus' mastery over the temptations of the body and the world show us that all things are possible. It certainly won't be an easy stroll through the park, but struggling through the challenges of the body and the world have a purifying and preparatory effect on our lives to come.

We begin our Lenten experience in the desert with Jesus but we also cling to his example that, by his Word, we might find true life and strength to battle the temptations we will face in the coming days. May we walk through this desert time knowing that Jesus walks beside us.

### **Finance Committee Report**

This is a report from the Finance Committee that held its scheduled meeting on Monday, 13th February 2023 at Stella Maris. In attendance were Bev Nunan, Fr Peter Brannelly, John Legg, Lorraine Cush, Peter Donelan, Tim Hishon with apologies from Fr William Aupito Iuliano and Deacon Isaac Falzon. The main items discussed included:

- ♦ After the opening prayer the **parish accounts** were examined. Thanks to the generosity of parishioners and visitors on holidays, December's income was \$88,855 less expenses of \$66,320 leaving a surplus for the month of \$22,535, compared to budget of \$12,490. At the end of 2021 our outstanding loan was \$1,906,518. At the end of 2022 our outstanding loan is \$1,740,130 a reduction of \$166,388.
- ♦ The committee members were advised that the budget for 2023 is in the process of being finalised. The Parish financial year ends in December and the books and records will be **audited**.
- ♦ Fr Brannelly led a discussion on the establishment of an Endowment Fund for the parish. Endowed Funds are permanent investment funds from which a distribution is paid annually to support the life and ministry of the parish. The funds capital is preserved but keeps generating annual interest to provide an income stream for the parish. Through a bequest or if a parishioner donates money to the **Parish Endowment Fund** it guarantees that their generosity will continue to support the parish year after year. Many parishes are already a part of an independent and professionally run endowment programme established by our Archdiocese. The committee supported the establishment of an Endowment Fund for our Parish.
- ♦ A list of **maintenance** items were tabled and acted upon, including: At St Catherine's the painting of verandah and external wooden doors, repair of broken seats, electrical upgrade and need for a new mowing and garden contractor. At Stella Maris, approval was given for the next phase of the preventive maintenance work on the external vertical beams and timber posts. A report is being prepared into the external speakers which are being impacted by the corrosive salt air. St Mary's *A sbestos Management Plan* will be updated and a quote is being prepared for the carpet in the church to be steamed cleaned. St Peter's *A sbestos Management Plan* will also be updated, and their list of maintenance included the removal of outdoor seating, electrical upgrade and annual roof inspection.
- ♦ The committee decided to proceed with the non-structural renovations to the **Parish Office** at Stella Maris. The goal of the renovations is to open up the office and, importantly, to convert the current sacristy and chair storage room into a meeting room.
- ♦ After investigation it was agreed that the **piano** at St Catherine's, which can no longer be tuned, needs to be replaced. Discussions will be held to ascertain what would be the most appropriate musical instrument to replace the piano.
- A proposal was tabled to increase the **gathering area** at Stella Maris by concreting the triangle shaped garden outside the sacristy. The parishioners who put forward the proposal are involved in the hospitality ministry and they identified the current confined gathering space and the advantages of extending the gathering area. The committee agreed to look at their proposal in more detail at the next meeting.
- ♦ Brisbane Catholic Education has approached the parish enquiring about the possibility of extending the upper car park at St Catherine's. No decision was made. If the proposal were to proceed in effect this would be alienation of parish land and would need independent valuations and the approval of the Archdiocesan Property & Planning as well as the College of Consultors.
- ♦ In the Workplace Health and Safety report there were no incidents reported or ongoing. There was no rectification work identified, since the last meeting the Finance Committee.

The meeting closed with prayer. The next meeting of the Parish Finance Committee will be on Monday evening, March 13.
