## JESUS THE CORNERSTONE

In recent times, construction companies in Australia have taken strain with shortages in building materials, which has led to delays in building projects that has resulted in some companies going into liquidation. Having the correct materials and building skills is essential to complete buildings that meet safety standards. Since ancient times, builders have used cornerstones in their construction projects. A cornerstone was the principal stone, usually placed at the corner of a structure, to guide the workers in their course. The cornerstone was usually one of the largest, the most solid, and the most carefully constructed or chosen of any in the structure. The Bible describes Jesus as the cornerstone upon which His church is built. He is foundational. Once the cornerstone was set, it became the basis for determining every measurement in the remaining construction; everything was aligned to it. As the Cornerstone of the building of the Church, Jesus is our standard of measure and alignment.

The scriptures speak a lot about rocks and stones. The book of Isaiah has many references to the coming Messiah and in several places the Messiah is referred to as "the cornerstone".

In the New Testament, the cornerstone metaphor is continued. St Paul desires for the Ephesian Christians to know Christ better: "Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord" (Ephesians 2:19–21).

What Isaiah said centuries before is affirmed by St Peter in this week's second reading. Jesus, as our cornerstone, is "chosen by God and precious to Him". The Cornerstone is also reliable, and "the one who trusts in Him will never be put to shame.".

Unfortunately, not everyone aligns with the Cornerstone. Some accept Christ; some reject Him. Jesus is the "stone the builders rejected" (Mark 12:10). Jesus was in fact rejected many times during his life on earth, but most especially at his crucifixion where he paid the ultimate price for our salvation.

How can people reject God's chosen, precious Cornerstone? Simply put, they want to build something different from what God is building. Jesus is indeed our Cornerstone and the rock of our salvation.

We pray that in our troubled world today, more people will look to Jesus as the Cornerstone and foundation on which our salvation is built. Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father except through Me".

We keep these young boys and girls and their families in our prayers during these weeks – please note that over these next 4 weeks while the preparation is on there will be no 5:30pm Monday Mass.

## **Eucharistic Ministers**

Our Eucharistic Ministers who take Holy Communion to our fellow Catholics who are sick, housebound or who reside in one of the numerous aged care facilities within our Parish, undertake a vital ministry that we don't take for granted. For many, our Eucharistic Ministers are the link that keeps the connection with our Parish Community alive and they act as the visible face of the Church. Last Saturday morning all the Communion Ministers gathered at Stella Maris to reflect upon their ministry and to ensure they were following the correct protocols. Every year we are required to send to the Archbishop the names of those who are commissioned as Eucharistic Ministers and last Saturday's gathering allowed us also to agree upon our Parish protocols.

- ~Only designated Eucharistic Ministers are permitted to take Holy Communion from the Church.
- ~The ministry takes place on the day and preferably the Eucharistic Minister is commissioned at the end of Mass.
- ~Before Mass starts the Eucharistic minister records their details so that there is a record.

Once again, we are blessed as a community to have so many generous parishioners who are willing to give of their time to fulfil this important ministry. If you would like to join this ministry please contact Fr Peter or Fr William.

We are fortunate to have those large glass doors at Stella Maris that open up to provide excellent ventilation and additional capacity when we have big crowds. ## We Need You



#### Responding to Abuse and the Abused

"In responding to abuse and the abused, we need to move beyond considerations of law and finance... Of course, we need to attend to legal and financial matters, but the paramount concern needs to be the good of those abused. Not all victims and survivors look to the Church for spiritual and pastoral accompaniment and care, but some do and others may in time, if ever trust can be established. We can learn from experience elsewhere in seeking to respond more effectively to abuse and the abused. Unless we do, this will remain a gaping wound — certainly for victims and survivors but for the whole Church as well — which makes it hard for us to move in the future."

May, in the Catholic Church, is traditionally (since the 13th Century!) celebrated as the *Month of Mary*, a time to honour Mary, mother of Jesus and mother of the Church. This time allows us to acknowledge both Mary's privileged relationship to Jesus and her symbolic relationship to the Church as a role model and woman of faith. Learning about Mary is part of the RE curriculum for all our students:

- In **Prep**, students listen and respond to stories that tell of Jesus' mother Mary, his family and friends.
- In **Year 1**, students recognise some ways in which believers past and present honour Mary, Mother of Jesus, including praying the Hail Mary. Our Year 1 students created our Mary Garden at school.
- In Year 5, students examine Mary's role as mother of Jesus and mother of the Church. They analyse the elements and features of some Marian prayers including the Hail Mary, the Rosary and the Litany of the Mary of Nazareth to describe the role of Marian prayer in the lives of believers past and present.
- In Years 2-4 and 6, while there is not a specific focus on Mary, students reflect on Mary's role in Jesus' birth, his ministry and his final days; and then in being part of the early Christian community.
