Dear Friends, Thank You!

As you read this I am either 30 or 31 days ordained a Priest and it's been a wild ride already. Over these last 30/31 days there has been one clear theme for me - that theme being how generous and kind people are. Particularly how generous and kind you all have been to me during this ordination period.

Generosity, which is one of the fruits of the Spirit is an essential disposition for us all to cultivate because it is a virtue that articulates and orders people towards the source and goal of their Christian practice — God. Therefore, it is quite fitting that Holy Mother Church has prescribed the Gospel reading about the treasure, the pearl and the net. In these parables the essence lies not only in the act of giving but also in the rewards that follow. Jesus emphasises the abundant blessings bestowed upon those who embrace the virtue of generosity. When we give selflessly and wholeheartedly, we are promised the gift of finding something far more valuable than material possessions — a reward that can't be measured by temporal goods.

Moreover, as we embrace generosity, we engage in acts of kindness that impart grace and goodness to the lives of others. The parable of the fishing net that is cast into the sea is a reminder that our acts of kindness create a ripple effect, touching the hearts of numerous individuals. This means that the rewards of generosity extend to the individual and their circle of influence, inspiring them to spread kindness and love to others.

Furthermore, the parable of the master of the house who brings out treasures old and new encourages us to cherish the wisdom passed down through generations. Those who generously share their insights and experiences (take St Augustine as one example of many) not only leave a lasting impact on others but also contribute to the enrichment of collective knowledge and understanding. In other words, generosity can be shown through wisdom and knowledge as well as temporal goods.

Therefore, the rewards of generosity are seen not only in the next life but in this life as well. Generosity allows us to discover hidden treasures that enrich our lives and the lives of those around us, and betters our chances at reaching the kingdom of heaven.

May the stories of the hidden treasure, the pearl of great value, and the other parables inspire us to continue to develop this wonderful spirit of generosity and kindness that is present here at Stella Maris Parish. As we share kindness, love, and compassion, we partake in a transformative journey that not only brings joy and fulfilment but also shapes a better, more compassionate world for all.

Again, I want to thank each and every one of you for the kindness and generosity that you have shown me over this last period. Thank you!

This year, Stella Maris School participated in an external review process for our Religious Education (RE) Program, including both the classroom learning and teaching of the RE curriculum and the Religious Life of the School. Last week, we received our Certificate of Validation and our official Report. It outlines commendations for great work that is happening in this area at the school, as well as recommendations which inform future improvements.

In the category of 'Students and Community'. The commendations included:

- The Catholic story of the school is visible and apparent to both visitors and community members through weaving of school values (based on Presentation Charism) through behaviour matrix, formation plans, iconography and RE curriculum.
- Strong connections between parish and school.
- Use of parent newsletter to provide formation and education on faith issues and RE curriculum.
- Use of tours to foster connection between school and prospective parents.
- Provision of a text to all staff each year, which can be linked to the school charism.
- Authentic links between curriculum and social justice activities provide students with the means to connect learning, life and the wider community.
- The establishment and engagement of the Deadly Maroochy Mob for authentic purposes.
- The inclusivity of staff prayer.
- Laudato Sì initiatives evident through curriculum links and school garden.
- Harnessing of school performing and visual arts to enhance the Religious Life of the School.
