TO OUR CATHOLIC COMMUNITIES IN AUSTRALIA

Dear friends.

I'm sure October 7 is etched in our memories now as a day when once again the Middle East, and particularly the Holy Land, was devastated with a new wave of violence. The Franciscans have, for eight centuries, been responsible for the care of the many sacred places, as well as schools and parishes in Israel, Gaza and the West Bank.

It is difficult to not take sides in this conflict, but so far both sides have used extreme methods where many innocent people have been killed.

With Hamas' initial attack on innocent Israeli citizens – infants, children, youth and the elderly – killing more than 1,000, wounding many others and taking 200 hostages, and Israel's response of blocking food, water, fuel, medical supplies and demanding that more than a million people leave their homes; are both acts of extremism and difficult for us in Australia to comprehend.

Pope Francis has called for peace: "Terrorism and extremism do not help reach a solution to the conflict between Israelis and Palestinians, but fuel hatred, violence, revenge and only cause each other to suffer. The Middle East does not need war, but peace, a peace built on dialogue and the courage of fraternity... Please do not shed any more innocent blood, neither in the Holy Land, nor in Ukraine, nor anywhere else! Enough! Wars are always a defeat, always!"

Besides looking after the pilgrims and pilgrimage sites, the Franciscans look after 15 schools in the Israel/Palestine area and offer wide-ranging housing and social support programmes. The Latin Patriarch looks after another 10 schools. There are two Catholic schools in the Gaza parish – they are part of the Holy Family Parish and part of the Latin Patriarchate. Both communities are currently sheltering families and will need help when the current violence stops. The Holy Child School in Bethlehem provides an intense therapeutic day treatment programme and alternative education for children in the Bethlehem region who suffer from untreated complex mental health issues and exposure to intergenerational trauma.

At this time, I ask you on behalf of all those affected by this conflict to pray for peace. In the near future, I hope to have more information on how you can help but for now, prayer is the best answer.

Let us pray with Psalm 122, 6-9:

Ask for peace for Jerusalem:
may those who love you live in safety;
let there be peace in your walls,
safety in your palaces.
For my brothers and my friends, I will say:
Upon you be peace!
By the house of the Lord our God,
I will ask good for you.

WHEN ARE WE GOING TO HAVE THE WINE AGAIN?

Many people have asked this question of our clergy over the past few weeks. As many of us recall, our main hindrance at the time was COVID. Obviously, the virus is still circulating, but we would like to reintroduce the Communion Cup to our communities across the parish. We will begin again with the Communion Cup on the Feast of Christ the King, 26 November. A few things to keep in mind as we begin again. If you feel "under the weather" you should refrain from the chalice. The practice of intinction (dipping of Communion host into the chalice) is **NOT** permitted. This is seen as a *self-service* which goes against the meaning of Communion and sharing in the common cup as brothers and sisters. Remember also, that receiving from the chalice is a meaningful experience, but it is not necessary to receive the fullness of Christ in Holy Communion, so if you do not wish to take from the chalice then that is fine. As we draw closer to the date, we look forward in anticipation to joining with the Apostles who themselves received the cup from Christ. May we come alive in faith and be more like what we consume in the Eucharist.

CATECHISM CORNER

What happened to Confirmation names? It's long been the custom in the Catholic Church that the *Confirmand* would take on the name of a saint during Confirmation. Yet, the naming after a saint has never been an official part of the sacrament. The basic thought behind this custom was really to adopt a heavenly patron or to honour a saint to whom one had a special devotion. Some dioceses would opt for reaffirming the name given to you at your Baptism. As parents themselves put time and effort into the process, and the name itself has become part of your identity, people would often come to appreciate the name they were given. When we think about Baptism, the formula itself establishes a connection to Confirmation. At Baptism we use 'N. I baptise you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.' At Confirmation we use 'N. Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.' Both begin with the name of the individual as a way of identifying and claiming them as God's own. The naming of a saint is still around but some dioceses and parishes might differ in this practice.

PRISON SUNDAY

The Church in Australia marks Prison Sunday this weekend. Prison Sunday commenced in 2016, during the Year of Mercy, as an initiative of Pope Francis to observe the Jubilee for Prisoners. "We need to nourish the roots of our hope so that they can bear fruit ... despite whatever evil we have done. There is no corner of our heart that cannot be touched by God's love," Pope Francis said at the time.



Each year on the 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Catholic Church in Australia marks Prison Sunday, bringing attention to the plight of prisoners and highlighting the important work that prison chaplains undertake.

"Let's think of our incarcerated brothers and sisters, and let's think about the tenderness of God for them and pray for them so that they may find in that window of hope a way out toward a better life.", Pope Francis has said.
