OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

THE SHEPHERD KING

This week we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus is indeed our Lord and King but he defied the expectations of kingship for those in His time, and for us in ours. Throughout history, Kings and rulers used their armies to conquer lands and gain power and wealth. Jesus conquered sin by offering His own life. He came, not as a powerful ruler to conquer lands, but as servant and shepherd of His flock and to pay the price for the sin of humankind. Jesus is both servant and king, king and servant. For Him, these two identities go hand in hand. He is both a leader who serves, and a servant who leads.

Jesus says, "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant ... For the Son of man came not to be served but to serve." Jesus is a leader who serves, a king who walks among His people, not one who reigns from a mighty throne.

In Jesus, we have a king who not only serves, but is willing to die for us. Jesus defies our expectations and redefines the cultural understanding of who and what a king is. He uses His authority to teach others about God and God's kingdom, and uses His power to heal the sick and grant sight to the blind. Jesus uses His position to be an example of how to live in response to God's love.

But what does this all mean for us? Yes, we regard Jesus as our King who came to serve, but we are not kings ourselves. Each of us is, however, a leader in one way or another, which means we can follow Jesus' example of servant leadership. We are called to use our leadership roles, whether it be at work, in our families or communities, to benefit others. While we are not the saviour of the world like Jesus, there are plenty of ways for us to be servant-leaders.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples, "When the Son of Man comes in all His glory, with all His Angels, all the nations will sit before Him and He will separate them one from another as a Shepherd separates the sheep from the goats". Jesus loves and cares for us as a shepherd does his sheep but also reminds us what makes us worthy to enter into His sheepfold, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' Whatever you did to the least of these, you did for me".

Let us honour Christ as our King, and follow His example, by leading and living as servant leaders who aim to serve others and especially those in greatest need.

CHRISTMAS APPEAL

In the six months, May to October 2023, Maroochydore and Coolum conferences of St Vincent de Paul Society have given over \$70,000 of assistance to 2,100 local people seeking support to cope with rising costs of living, household bills, health impacts, domestic and family violence and other distress in their lives. Every day, individuals and families are helped by Vincentians with food and grocery items, essential furniture and whitegoods, travel and transport costs and payment of pharmacy prescriptions. Vincentians offer their time, information, advocacy and friendship that is not included in this dollar figure.

This weekend, the annual Vinnies Christmas Appeal will be held across our parish. Historically, contributions from parishioners to our two annual appeals provide approximately 20% of the two conferences combined income. This enables the Society to assist the most vulnerable in our community.

ANNUAL FINANCE REPORT

This year has proven to be an unexpected year for The Parish Finance Council. Unfortunately we farewelled two members of our team resulting in some shifting of responsibilities and recruitment. The Finance Team has settled into a more comfortable rhythm since, but now as we move towards the end of the year, other things will naturally pick up along the way.

The Team would like to take the opportunity to say 'Thank You' to parishioners for the support they provided financially to the parish. Your contributions have aided in reducing Parish debt from \$1,728,370 to \$1,621,499.

We still have a way to go regarding our ministry internally and our mission externally, and we certainly will not be able to respond to these needs without your assistance financially.

We have been preparing for the future in many ways with the launch of our Parish Endowment Fund. As you may know, an endowment is a fund in which the principal deposit is permanently invested for growth. This fund will serve to support us as we receive interest over time.

Next year, we look forward to welcoming a NET (National Evangelisation Teams) Team into the parish to assist us in our efforts to reach the Youth and to support our existing parishioners. This, inevitably, will come at a cost to the parish with things like housing, transport and groceries to consider. We recognise that the time is **now** to respond to Youth activities in the parish, so we step out in faith, but we're conscious of the impact this will bring financially.

Many are also aware of the maintenance that occurs around the parish with each community wanting to steward the goods of the Church. We work closely alongside trusted contractors and volunteers to make sure that we maintain and protect our communities.

With all this in mind, we press forward in confidence knowing that the Lord will assist us along the way. We have skilled workers and generous volunteers who help to juggle all the moving parts of Church finances, for whom we are also thankful.

Yet, this is a time to look forward in hope. We have the opportunity to respond to these financial endeavours with a sense of adventure and faith. Perhaps we could build stronger connections as a community around social fundraising events like a Parish Dinner Dance or Talent Night. The possibilities are endless.

Ultimately, this is a word of 'thanks' and 'appreciation' to you, our parishioners. May this upcoming season of Advent prepare us anew for Christ's coming and may our lives be refreshed as we look to a new year. Fr William
