

The Mullet is making a Comeback!

As soon as most of us hear the word "Mullet", we think of fish and chips and what's for dinner on Friday! But some of us with longer memories and photos capturing more regrettable fashion styles will also recall "the mullet" as a hairstyle best consigned to the 1970s and 1980's – *it is amazing what we once thought was cool and fashionable!!!* Well, the terrifying news is that "the mullet" is making a comeback! Fr Isaac is going to grow a mullet this month to raise awareness of the work of the Black Dog Institute in support of their important work.

One in five of us will experience symptoms of mental illness in any given year. In Australia, that's around 5 million people. And roughly 60% of these people won't seek help. More alarmingly, 9 people in Australia die by suicide every day. Over 75% of mental health problems occur before the age of 25. Suicide is the leading cause of death for people



aged 15-44 in Australia. And over 50% of people don't seek professional help when they're struggling with their mental health.

So, this April Fr Isaac will be rocking a mullet to raise funds and awareness for



suicide prevention and mental health research.

"My mullet and funds raised will help Black Dog Institute drive real change and fund ground-breaking mental health research. This will put digital services and education into

the hands of people who need it the most." Fr Isaac said. "It would mean a lot to me if you donated to support my mullet. Together, we can create better mental health for all Australians." Your Commitment:

News from our Parish Catholic Schools

Stella Maris Primary School Last Thursday the whole school celebrated National Harmony Day with a special assembly. Did you know we have families from twenty different countries attending our school? Harmony Day encourages everyone to appreciate and celebrate differences, promoting a sense of community and belonging. The school driveway was bedecked with palms this week as we entered into the most important week of the Church's year—Holy Week. We conclude this term with a whole school liturgy retelling the story of this special week. Each year level has a special part in the storytelling. From all of us here at Stella Maris Primary School, to our beautiful parish community, we wish you a happy and holy Easter!

Siena Primary School On Monday, we started our Holy Week journey. Our Year 1 students reverently and enthusiastically re-enacted the Palm Sunday story where Jesus triumphantly entered into Jerusalem amidst the cheering crowds waving their palm branches. This was followed by a beautiful, solemn portrayal of The Last Supper and The Washing of the feet by the Year 5 cohort.
