Happy Mother's Day! We also hit a milestone today within the "Great Fifty Days of Easter" as we celebrate The Ascension of the Lord this weekend. This is the formal ascension back to heaven of Jesus to God the Father after his bodily resurrection on earth. All the post-resurrection appearances and interactions of Jesus with his disciples were meant to prepare them to continue the great mission that Jesus had started with them. Even though the disciples must've been sad and even frightened that Jesus would be leaving them again physically, it was an important step for them to grow and mature in their own faith and ministry. Jesus often reminded his disciples not to "cling" to him because he would one day return to the Father. Jesus recognised the need for them to let go of his physical presence so that they would be able to realize the full potential of their own call and vocation to proclaim the Good News to the world.

Father Ron Rolheiser, a great Franciscan priest, once wrote, "The mystery of saying goodbye is really the mystery of the Ascension. The Ascension is about going away so that our loved ones can fully receive our spirit. It's about the mystery of saying goodbye, when goodbye isn't really goodbye at all, but only love's way of taking on a different modality. It then can be present in a way that's deeper, purer, more permanent, less-clinging, and less-limited by the tensions, disappointments, inadequacies, wounds, and betrayals that, this side of eternity, forever make our intimacy a work in progress." So, the Ascension is not really goodbye for Jesus, but it is our God trusting and loving us so much that he passes on to us the great work of building up his kingdom in this world, until we meet him in the kingdom of heaven.

Speaking of goodbyes – after what now seems like such a short time – I will be heading back home to America this week. It has been a true privilege to come to know so many of you and to celebrate Mass and the Sacraments with you since Holy Week back in March. I hope you treasure your wonderful parish and all your beautiful churches and ministries. May you all continue to build up the kingdom of God here on the Sunshine Coast of Australia. I am grateful to Father Peter and Father Isaac for allowing me to share their home and priestly ministry here during this time. When I return to The States, I will move to a new mission or assignment at Saint Francis Xavier Parish, the Jesuit parish of Phoenix, Arizona. Upload birth certificate (pc or laptop only) 3. To comply with government legislation both parents must sign the parental authority 4. Choose a godparent (must be Catholic 16

years or older in good standing with the Church)

## **NET REPORT**

As a team, we've been kept busy with lots of Siena Catholic College and Parish events and activities!

To start with, we began the school holidays by attending a three-day retreat at Alexandra Headland facilitated by Alpha Youth Australia. (You may remember the Parish running the Alpha series a few years back.) Together with two students from Siena – as well as 120 other students and youth leaders from different Christian denominations across Australia – we were formed and trained in running the Alpha Youth series and its precursor, the Life Essentials series, in school and youth groups. Next week, we're going to begin running the Life Essentials series during break time on Friday – pizza and a ping pong tournament will be essential components in this launch!



During the holidays we were also part of Junior Ministers and 'Fun Days With God', which were great ways to meet and spend time with lots of the children in our parish. We loved joining the Junior Ministers to learn more about altar serving, to eat pizza and to play some Easter-themed games! At Fun Days With God, we got to join in the games and the arts and craft and learn more about the Easter story with 43 children! Many thanks to Bernie for putting together such wonderful days.

Once Term 2 started, we went to Siena's Year 12 Retreat at Lake Somerset, which was an excellent opportunity to spend time with the Year 12 students and get to know them better through conversations at meal times and free times, as well as joining in their small groups. We also ran a session on the second evening. The session began with Mass (huge thanks to Fr Isaac!); then we shared about how we can lay down our burdens and give them to Jesus. The session finished with a time of Eucharistic Adoration, during which the students were invited to bring their burdens to Jesus and lay them at the foot of the altar. Fr Isaac also was available for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during this time, which a handful of students took up! Overall, we reckon it was a huge success!

In addition to all of this, we've enjoyed running in Siena's Cross Country Carnival with the students, being part of Religion classes, meeting students at break times and even going to the zoo at Wildlife HQ with the Year 7s!
